

**VILLAGE OF SALISBURY**

**BY-LAW NO. 23**

**A by-law of the Village of Salisbury to regulate traffic.**

The Council of the Village of Salisbury duly assembled hereby enacts as follows:

1. In this by-law
  - (a) Chief of Police means the person in charge of the detachment of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police located in the Village of Petitcodiac; or other Police Chief that may at any time be appointed.
  - (b) Village means the Village of Salisbury.
  - (c) Provincial Through Highway means that section of the following highways within the Village boundaries, or portions designated herein.
    - (a) Route 106. (Main Street)
    - (b) Route 112. (River Road and the Old Fredericton Road)

2. Motor Vehicle Act

The definitions in Section 1 of the Motor Vehicle Act apply to this by-law.

3. Traffic Control

Traffic control devices shall be the responsibility of the respective authorities, for the Provincial Highways - the Department of Transportation and Village Highways - the Village of Salisbury, except that the Village of Salisbury shall also be responsible for traffic control devices placed on Provincial highways for regulations specific to this by-law.

4. Parking

(a) No person shall stop, stand or park a Vehicle which is attended or unattended on any of the following highways(s) or part(s) of highway(s) in the Village which has been marked with proper traffic control devices.

(1) The south side of Main Street between Douglas Street and River Road.

(b) No person shall, except for the purposes of delivering or taking delivery, stop, stand or park a commercial Vehicle, trailer or semi-trailer which exceeds 205 centimetres in width or 10 metres in length on any highway in the village.

(c) For the purpose of snow removal no person shall stand or park a Vehicle on any highway within the Village between the hours of 1:00am and 7:00am from the first day of November in any year until the first day of April in the following year.

(d) Any Peace Officer of the Village or person designated by the Village authorities may remove and impound any Vehicle which is found illegally parked within the Village. All costs and charges for removal, care and storage of such Vehicles shall be paid for by the owner thereof before its release.

5. Penalties

(a) Any person who violates any provision of this by-law is guilty of an offense and liable to a penalty of not less than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) nor more than fifty dollars (\$50.00).

(b) Notwithstanding Section 5.(a) a violator may pay an amount equal to the minimum penalty plus any costs to an authorized person, and upon such payment, not be liable to further prosecution, provided the violation is not one for which the Registrar of Motor Vehicles shall assess points under Section 297 (2) of the motor Vehicle Act Chapter M-17.
