

VILLAGE OF SALISBURY

BY-LAW NO. 22

PREVENTION OF ACCIDENTS FROM SUNDRY CAUSES

BE IT ENACTED by the council of the Village of Salisbury as follows:

1. No person shall blast and rock, stone or earth, with dynamite or other explosive substance on or near any street, sidewalk, or public grounds within the Village, without providing and at all times maintaining a proper shield covering or guard upon such rock, stone or earth, sufficient to prevent any part or parts thereof from being thrown by force or an explosion into, or over or upon any street, sidewalk or square within the Village.
 2. (a) No person shall set on fire or throw any squib, cap, firecracker, rocket, fireworks or other preparation containing gun powder or other explosive substance; or discharge any gun, pistol, or other firearms or any air gun, air rifle or any such toy or gadget within the Village, provided that nothing herein contained shall be held to apply to the legitimate use or firearms, where provided for the by-law of the Village or under statutory authority. No person shall establish or operate a shooting gallery within the Village without having first obtained from the Village Council a permit to do so.

(b) Save and excepting law enforcement officers no person shall carry, transport or otherwise convey any loaded firearm, airgun, or weapon suitable for hunting, or be involved in the act of hunting as defined in the Fish and Wildlife Act of New Brunswick, with the boundaries of the Municipality of the Village of Salisbury.

(c) A law enforcement officer may seize a firearm, airgun, or weapon suitable for hunting and any wildlife as defined in the Fish and Wildlife Act of New Brunswick, from any person who violates this by-law.

(d) Upon conviction of the person in possession of the items seized under Section 2(c) of this by-law, the law enforcement officer shall deliver the items seized to the nearest game warden, or deputy warden, for safekeeping and ultimate disposition.
- Loaded means:
- (a) that a live cartridge had been inserted in the firing chamber of the firearm and/or
 - (b) that a tubular, clip, or cylinder type magazine containing live ammunition is attached or affixed to the firearm.
3. Every person who violates this by-law is guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine of not more than two hundred dollars (\$200.00) and in default of payment and upon summary of conviction is liable to imprisonment in accordance with subsection 31(3) of the Summary of Conviction Act (Section 198)
 4. This by-law shall be administered by the Policing Authority of the Village of Salisbury.
